SARAJEVO DECLARATION

MARRI Regional Forum - Sarajevo, 14 June 2019

We, the Ministers and High Representatives responsible for the issues of migration, asylum and refugees from Albania, North Macedonia, Bosnia and Herzegovina, Serbia, Montenegro and Kosovo* in the format of the Migration, Asylum, Refugees, Regional Initiative (MARRI);

Guided by the principles laid down in the founding documents of MARRI, the MARRI Strategy 2018-2020, the Declaration of MARRI Regional Forum held in Tirana, 12 June 2018 and by the Priorities of the Bosnia and Herzegovina Presidency-in-Office;

Having regard to achieving a regional vision on migration aligned with European perspectives;

Committed to support at regional level stability, safety and prosperity of MARRI Participants as well as to protect external EU borders, while respecting the international human rights protection standards;


Determined to further encourage a successful MARRI Legal Framework Reform, with the key goal to valorise MARRI's ultimate potentials;

Acknowledging the efforts and the results of the Presidency of Bosnia and Herzegovina, and in particular:

- Successful completion of the project Support of the sustainable development of cooperation among Border Police in South-Eastern Europe (BORDAIRPOL II) by organizing one Annual meeting of four MARRI networks and one Joint training on presentation of VEGA Handbook: Children at Airports;
- organizing Regional Meeting on Readmission in the Western Balkans under the auspices of the Presidency-in-Office, together with IOM, a first Readmission Meeting with participation from the

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European Commission and other important stakeholders from all MARRI Participants in Sarajevo, May 2019;

- implementing joint activities with IOM under the Project Regional Support to Protection-Sensitive
 Migration Management in the Western Balkans and Turkey funded by IPA II, such as further
 capacitating the MARRI Regional Centre with two experts in the framework of this support, in particular
 - rolling-out, finalizing and deepening through on-the-job trainings the Regional Remote Interpretation Service (MARRI RRIS);
 - developing the Regional Migration Data Exchange Platform in the Western Balkans (WB-MIDEX);
- strengthening the cooperation with German International Cooperation by organizing:
 - 5 regional workshops titled "Strengthening regional dialogue and cooperation on migration" under the project "Strengthening regional migration governance" including Governmental officials, the Academia, International and Civil Society Organisations;
 - one Workshop discussing MARRI basic documents and one meeting for preparation of **Plan** for **Finalization of MARRI Basic Documents**;
- welcoming an increased cooperation with the European Asylum Support Office (EASO) in the
 framework of the IPA II Project Regional Support to Protection-Sensitive Migration Management in the
 Western Balkans and Turkey, discussing opportunities to support MARRI RC to coordinate trainings in
 the area of asylum within MARRI Participants;
- marking 15 years of MARRI existence at a Friends' Meeting / Diplomatic Briefing in April 2019 where Participants, partners and stakeholders expressed their commitment to MARRI for furthering the cooperation;
- strengthening and deepening the collaboration with IOM, FRONTEX, EASO, GIZ, ICMPD and other relevant organisations, the regional non-governmental sector and academia in the areas of migration;
- completing the selection and appointment of Programme Manager and Communication Officer at MARRI Regional Centre;

We have gathered at the regular annual Meeting of the Forum and confirmed the following:





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- We endorse the Annual Report of MARRI June 2018 June 2019 and the Financial Report for 2018;
- We adopt the Priorities and the Annual Programme of Activities for the period June 2019 June 2020;
- We endorse the Plan for Finalization of Basic Documents;
- We welcome the Joint Statement on Strategic Cooperation between MARRI RC and IOM;
- Aware that internal functionality represents one of the key challenges of MARRI, we confirm our readiness to support timely the implementation of all regular activities of MARRI RC;
- We agree that the next Presidency should be held by Kosovo*.

We encourage MARRI RC, as the Secretariat of this Initiative, to implement the planned activities and continue further reforms;

We would like to thank the European Commission, IOM, the German government, GIZ and the State Secretariat for Migration of the Swiss Confederation for their support;

We encourage the MARRI Participants' Foreign Ministers to explore possibilities for MARRI to be positioned as Central Migration Agency for Western Balkans;

We appreciate and commend the efforts and results of Bosnia and Herzegovina during its Presidency and we hereby express our full confidence for a successful Presidency of Kosovo* for the period June 2019 - June 2020.
