PROJECT OVERVIEW

On behalf of the German Federal Ministry for Economic Cooperation and Development (BMZ), the Deutsche Gesellschaft für Internationale Zusammenarbeit (GIZ) is implementing the regional project "Preventing and Combatting Trafficking in Human Beings in the Western Balkans (PaCT)". The project advises public authorities and civil society organizations (CSOs) in the Western Balkans on how to establish the underlying conditions to improve the situation for (potential) victims of human trafficking.

The strategic partner of the project is the Migration, Asylum, Refugees Regional Initiative (MARRI) – the regional intergovernmental organisation on migration – with its Regional Centre in Skopje, North Macedonia.

The two main target groups of the project are migrants and refugees in the Western Balkan region and vulnerable groups from the Western Balkans who are particularly at risk of being trafficked such as, for example, members of the Roma minority.

PaCT four fields of action:



Prevention: Making vulnerable groups more resilient to the risks of human trafficking



<mark>Protection:</mark> Better identifying (potential) victims of human trafficking



Partnership:

Improving coordination and cooperation between different institutions and referral mechanisms



Support services:

Offering education and training as well as advisory services in the area of mental health and psychosocial support tailored to the requirements of the target groups

APPROACH: AWARENESS RAISING (AR)

Trafficking in human beings is a crime that knows no borders. Human beings are trafficked in every corner of the world. Increase in migration, further increases problem of trafficking and exploitation of the migrants. An important tool in combating and preventing trafficking in human beings (THB) is causes signs, raising awareness around and trafficking. consequences of Anti-trafficking campaigns focus on educating people about the true nature of that crime and its consequences.

To support this endeavour, the project developed an Awareness Raising Toolbox that contains step-by-step quidelines and tools for the preparation and of management awareness raising campaigns, all from covering stages the first idea to the delivery and evaluation of results. one of the actors lf vou are engaged in raising efforts, awareness check this out: https://toolboxes.marri-rc.org.mk. If the awareness raising activity is planned right, you will hopefully prevent some people from falling into the hands of human traffickers

MAIN PURPOSE OF THIS APPROACH

This approach focuses on the implementation of target group-oriented awareness and sensitisation campaigns. The main purpose is to increase the resilience of (potential) victims of trafficking in the region through prevention measures. The awareness raising campaigns provide potential victims with sufficient information about the risks of human trafficking and the possibilities for legal labour migration, so that they are able to make informed decisions about migration, to evaluate whether job offers are realistic, and to seek help in case of trafficking. The approach also aims to increase the awareness of other relevant target groups, including policymakers and relevant professionals and institutions working in the area of THB, to enhance their readiness to address THB adequately, and to strengthen their institutional capacity to counter it.
