## Danilo Šaranović

## Minister of the Interior



Danilo Šaranović, graduate in economics, was born in 1988 in Podgorica, where he completed primary and secondary economics school. He received his higher education at the Faculty of Economics of the University of Montenegro - majoring in Accounting and Auditing.

During and after his studies, he was engaged in various jobs in the profession, accounting and auditing, as well as in jobs in the field of informatics, research, data processing and analysis of public opinion and the market for goods and services.

He graduated from the School of Democratic Leadership.

He has been engaged in social and political work since he came of age.

He is the founder of the political party Democratic Montenegro, and he was elected president of the Young Democrats at the First Congress of the Young Democrats, a position he held for four years. He is a member of the Presidency of Democratic Montenegro.

In the parliamentary elections held in October 2016, he was elected as a deputy in the Parliament of Montenegro for the first time, and his second term as a deputy began after the parliamentary elections held in August 2020.

During his parliamentary engagement, he was a member of the Committee for Economy, Finance and Budget, the Committee for Anti-Corruption and the Committee for European Integration. He was a member of several working groups in the Parliament of Montenegro, of which membership in the Committee for Comprehensive Electoral Reform stands out. From December 2020 to April 2023, he was the head of the Montenegrin delegation in the NATO Parliamentary Assembly. In the same period, he was a permanent member of the PSSE Assembly (Southeastern European Cooperation Process).

In the local elections in Podgorica, held in October 2022, he was the holder of the coalition electoral list of Democratic Montenegro. In April 2023, he was elected deputy mayor of the Capital City of Podgorica.

On October 31, 2023, he was elected Minister of Internal Affairs in the 44th Government of Montenegro.
