II. ORGANIZATIONAL CONTEXT AND SCOPE	

MARRI – the Migration, Asylum, Refugees Regional Initiative – is a regional, intergovernmental organisation, composed of six Participants: Albania, North Macedonia, Bosnia and Herzegovina, Serbia, Montenegro, and Kosovo*. The mandate of MARRI is to strengthen regional migration policies and cooperation, develop professional competences and solutions for complex migration challenges through exchange of information, capacity building and harmonisation of legal frameworks towards the EU Acquis Communautaire.

MARRI's main executive body is the MARRI Regional Centre (MARRI RC) in Skopje that also serves as Secretariat of the Initiative.

Under the direct supervision of the MARRI RC Director, the successful candidate will be responsible for the execution of tasks related to collection, analysis, and publication of migration-related data in the Western Balkans.

III. RESPONSIBILITIES AND ACCOUNTABILITIES

- Collect and coordinate the provision of migration and asylum related data through the Regional Platform for Migration Data Exchange in the Western Balkans (WB-MIDEX);
 Regularly applying quality and quantity of data received through WB MIDEX;
- 2) Regularly analyze quality and quantity of data received through WB-MIDEX;
- Update and systemize regional data collection processes to ensure effective exchange of data through the WB-MIDEX Platform in line with the needs and priorities of MARRI Participants;
- 4) Draft and propose guidelines on the gathering, sharing, protection and dissemination of information to ensure continuous harmonization of statistical methodologies and practices among all six MARRI Participants;
- 5) Develop specialized data collection and dissemination plans for MARRI RC, from data entry, review, storage, analysis and publication to ensure the transparency and utility of data collection processes within MARRI RC;
- 6) Liaise with and advise the Statistical Focal Points of the Ministries of Interior / Security of the six MARRI Participants;
- Coordinate the work of MARRI Permanent Working Group on Migration Statistics, composed of MARRI RC Director, senior migration statistics experts from the Ministries of Interior / Security was well as Agencies for Statistics of the six MARRI Participants and MARRI RC team;
- 8) Support MARRI RC in developing and publishing periodical and ad hoc regional migration trends analysis reports for the Western Balkans based on the data contained in WB-MIDEX and other relevant sources;
- Continuously monitor developments related to migration statistics within the European Union, and provide MARRI RC and all six MARRI Participants with regular and timely updates on such developments;
- 10) Identify and develop concept notes for the upgrading and improvement of the WB-MIDEX Platform in line with EU standards, as needed;

- Provide technical guidance to MARRI related to migration-related statistics and ensure the technical functioning and sustainability of the WB-MIDEX Platform, in coordination with MARRI and the software maintenance service provider;
- 12) Organize and support the delivery of the project and MARRI events, such as regional meetings, workshops and trainings;
- 13) Communicate and coordinate, in consultation with the MARRI RC Director and the Programme Manager, with other donors and relevant stakeholders;
- 14) Provide inputs to relevant project reports and prepare narrative progress reports;
- 15) Perform other duties as may be required by the MARRI RC Director.

IV. REQUIRED QUALIFICATIONS AND EXPERIENCE

EDUCATION

- University degree in social statistics, migration studies, political science, social studies, security studies or a related field from an accredited academic institution.
 - Master's degree in above-mentioned fields would be considered as an advantage.

EXPERIENCE AND SKILLS

- Proven experience in collection and analysis of statistics, preferably in the field of migration;
- Experience in analysing data and producing reports for the purposes of public policy development;
- Previous experience with and knowledge of the statistical frameworks and standards in the European Union;
- Previous experience with and knowledge of the migration context in the Western Balkans;
- Proven previous experience and high level of proficiency in advanced statistical analysis software's (R, Python, PowerBi, SQL-Sever, and similar);
- Experience in drafting clearly and concisely, and solid communication and negotiation skills;
- Experience as part of internationally funded technical assistance projects is an advantage.
